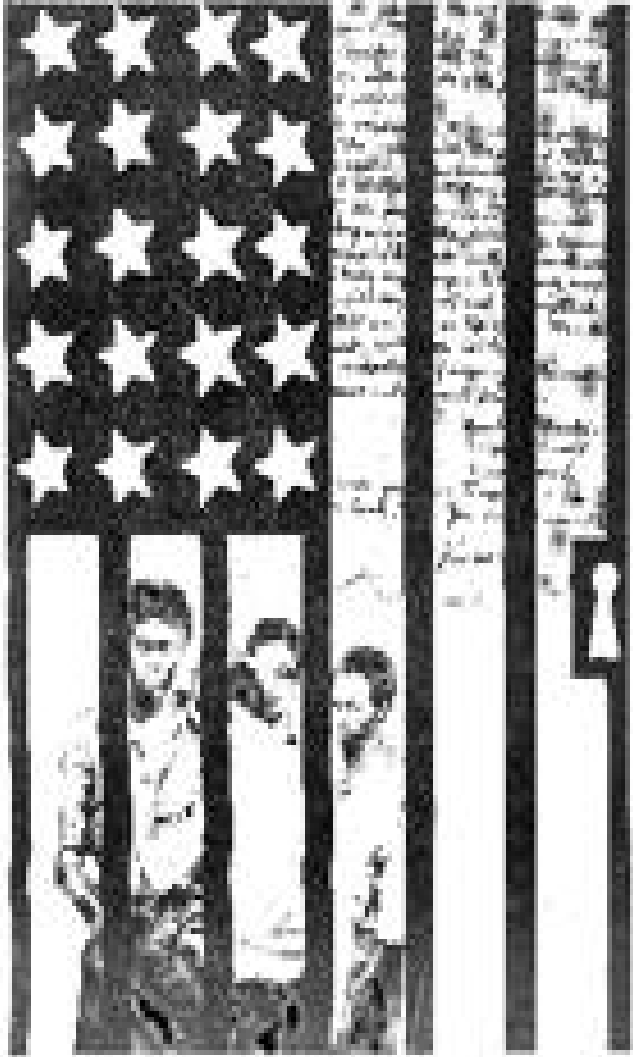


Prisoner Re-lease on Life Program



California has the second largest state prison population in the country. And for all those prisoners, getting out doesn't mean life gets easy. There are few programs behind bars and even fewer services for released prisoners.

The Maoist Internationalist Movement (MIM) works with prisoners in California and across the country, providing books and education, and fighting for the rights of prisoners as a part of the larger battle against imperialism. While many prisoners want to stay politically active when they hit the streets, the day to day struggle to find housing, a job, and other necessities becomes a barrier to survival, much less doing any political organizing. MIM doesn't have a prisoner re-lease program yet, but we are working to build one.

Here in California we need your help with this project. We want to set up a project that will serve released prisoners. We need people, cash and ideas to get this going. There are many ways you can help with this project: donate money, loan us money, provide the use of space in a building, or other resources, or help with the work of getting this program off the ground. If you have ideas or resources to contribute, let us know.

MIM does not have much money; we are run by volunteers and fund our work from donations. But we know that we can't think small. We need to set up independent institutions of the oppressed that serve the oppressed on a big scale. So work with us to set up a prisoner re-lease program, to help people get a new lease on life when they get out, and ensure that they stay active and productive revolutionaries on the outside.
